<u>Curriculum</u>

This term, our key questions are: <u>How does the geography of Kampong Ayer</u> <u>compare with the geography of where I</u> <u>live?</u>

Within the term we will be exploring fairy tales and traditional tales and reading for pleasure. Where do you like to read?

This term our class writing will be linked to Little Red Riding Hood by Lucy Rowland and Ben Mantle. It is about a little girl who meets a cunning wolf on her way to the library, he persuades her to stray from the path! We will be using Katie Morag stories for our Whole Class Reading sessions to explore and analyse the text in detail and use this to feed into our learning in all areas of the curriculum.

Maths will be focusing on place value and addition and subtraction. Using lots of practical ideas to aid learning. This will be supported by the Sumdog work set weekly.

In Science we will be looking at our local environment and what is around us, looking at our school grounds and just beyond.

Geography will see us exploring Kampong Ayer and how it compares to our local area, what is the same and what is different.
