We

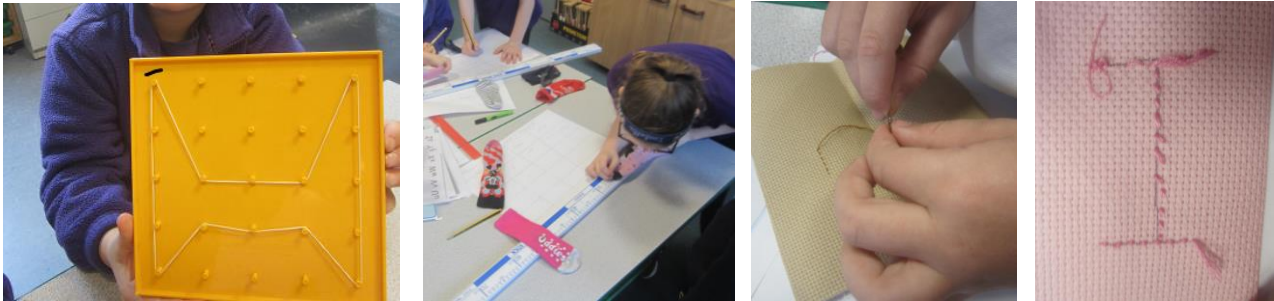
have been measuring socks to see which ones were the stretchiest.
